

Wakefield HS Registration Timeline

Selecting courses for next year is a process. See below for all activities that will take place for scheduling for 2014-2015.

January- All core teachers make recommendations of what students should take at the next level.

February and March- Counselors meet with all 9-11 graders to advise students about course selections for next year. They will review transcripts and explain course offerings.

February 6- Curriculum Fair- Come at 4:45 with your parents to see all of the classes Wakefield has to offer. This is your chance to ask questions of teachers by department.

February and March- Application Courses- If you are interested in PEPI, Newspaper, Yearbook, Early Childhood, etc. pick up an application from Student Services and turn it in to the advisor listed below.

Yearbook- Johnson- 308

Early Childhood- Bode- 2216

By March 21- Enter your course selections (8 primaries and 3 alternates) into PowerSchool.

By May- Verification/Course selection changes. Let your counselor know of any changes you would like to request.

June 10- Deadline to submit Mid-Year Graduation Application to Dr. Inscoe or your counselor.

July 25- Last day to drop AP classes.

Courses with fees/required hours:

Lifetime Sports- \$125 for bowling

Sports Medicine- 20 hours out of school

Health Science 2- \$4 CPR card

Apparel- \$5 pattern fee; will also have to purchase fabrics and supplies

All Fine Arts- \$40 lab fee and travel expenses

Early Childhood- \$15 scrubs and TB test (doctor visit)
